


GREEN STAGE PROVISOS FOR IN-PERSON ATTENDANCE

PSALM 45

- 1 My heart is inditing of a good matter: I speak of the things which I have made unto the King.
- 2 My tongue is the pen of a ready writer.
- 3 Thou art fairer than the children of men: full of grace are thy lips, because God hath bless'd thee for ever.
- 4 Gird thee with thy sword upon thy thigh, O thou most Mighty: according to thy worship and renown.

- 5 Good luck have thou with thine honour: ride on because of the word of truth, of meekness and righteousness, and thy right hand shall teach thee terrible things.
- 6 Thy arrows are very sharp, and the people shall be subdu'd unto thee: even in the midst among the king's enemies.
- 7 They seat O God endureth for ever: the sceptre of thy kingdom is a right sceptre.
- 8 Thou hast lov'd righteousness and hated iniquity: wherefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows.
- 9 All thy garments smell of myrrh, aloes and cassia: out of the ivory palaces, whereby they have made thee glad.
- 10 King's daughters were among the honourable women: upon thy right hand did stand the queen in a vesture of gold wrought about with divers colours.
- Hearken O daughter and consider, incline thine ear: forget also thine own people and thy father's house.
- 12 So shall the King have pleasure in thy beauty: for he is thy Lord God, and worship thou him.
- 13 And the daughter of Tyre shall be there with a gift: like as the rich also among the people, shall make their supplication before thee.
- 14 The King's daughter is all glorious within: her clothing is of wrought gold.
- 15 She shall be brought unto the King in raiment of needlework: the virgins that be her fellows shall bear her company, and shall be brought unto thee.
- 16 With joy and gladness shall they be brought: and shall enter into the King's palace.
- 17 Instead of thy fathers thou shalt have children: whom thou mayest make princes in all lands.
- 18 I will remember thy Name from one generation to another: therefore shall the people give thanks unto thee world without end.

FIRST LESSON: Jeremiah 31. 1-14

The First Lesson is written in the book of the prophet Jeremiah, in the thirty first chapter, beginning at the first verse.

At that time, says the Lord, I will be the God of all the families of Israel, and they shall be my people. Thus says the Lord: The people who survived the sword found grace in the wilderness; when Israel sought for rest, the Lord appeared to him from far away. I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have continued my faithfulness to you. Again I will build you, and you shall be built, O virgin Israel! Again you shall take your tambourines, and go forth in the dance of the merrymakers. Again you shall plant vineyards on the mountains of Samaria; the planters shall plant, and shall enjoy the fruit. For there shall be a day when sentinels will call in the hill country of Ephraim: 'Come, let us go up to Zion, to the Lord our God.' For thus says the Lord: Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and

raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, 'Save, O Lord, your people, the remnant of Israel.' See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labour, together; a great company, they shall return here. With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back, I will let them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn. Hear the word of the Lord, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands far away; say, 'He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd a flock.' For the Lord has ransomed Jacob, and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him. They shall come and sing aloud on the height of Zion, and they shall be radiant over the goodness of the Lord, over the grain, the wine, and the oil, and over the young of the flock and the herd; their life shall become like a watered garden, and they shall never languish again. Then shall the young women rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old shall be merry. I will turn their mourning into joy, I will comfort them, and give them gladness for sorrow. I will give the priests their fill of fatness, and my people shall be satisfied with my bounty, says the Lord.

The Second Lesson is written in the Gospel according to Saint John, in the nineteenth chapter beginning at the twenty third verse.

When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them into four parts, one for each soldier. They also took his tunic; now the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from the top. So they said to one another, 'Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see who will get it.' This was to fulfil what the scripture says, 'They divided my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots.' And that is what the soldiers did. Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, 'Woman, here is your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, / and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, / world without end. Amen.


APOSTLES' CREED


