ANNUAL VESTRY MEETING - Sunday, February 19, 2023

Early in the new year, Christine will be sending out requests for vestry reports to specific people, but you can avoid all that by sending in your report early. Just consider how impressed your fellow parishioners will be, when they read on our website about everything you have done at Saint Thomas's in the past year! You will also be envied by anyone who procrastinates on writing their own reports.
