


#### **GREEN STAGE PROVISOS FOR IN-PERSON ATTENDANCE**

#### PSALM: 62, Tone IV, 6



- 1 My soul truly waiteth in silence upon God; / for of him cometh my salvation.
- 2 He verily is my strength and my salvation; / he is my defence, so that I shall not greatly fall.
- 3 How long will ye set upon a man, battering him, all of you, / like a tottering wall, and like a broken fence?
- 4 Their device is only how to put him out whom God will exalt; / their delight is in lies; they give good words with their mouth, but curse with their heart.
- 5 Nevertheless, my soul, wait thou in silence upon God; / for my hope is in him.
- 6 He truly is my strength and my salvation; / he is my defence, so that I shall not fall.
- 7 In God is my health and my glory: / the rock of my might, and in God is my trust.
- 8 O put your trust in him alway, ye people: / pour out your hearts before him, for God is our hope.
- As for the sons of men, they are but vanity; yea, the sons of men are a deceit; / upon the scales they are altogether lighter than vanity itself.
- 10 O trust not in wrong and robbery, give not yourselves unto vanity; / if riches increase, set not your heart upon them.
- 11 God spake once, and twice I have also heard the same, / that power belongeth unto God;
- 12 And that thou, Lord, art merciful; / for thou renderest unto every man according to his work.

#### PSALM: 63, Tone VIII, 3



- 1 O God, thou art my God; / early will I seek thee.
- 2 My soul thirsteth for thee, my flesh also longeth after thee, / in a barren and dry land, where no water is.
- 3 Thus have I looked upon thee in the sanctuary, / that I might behold thy power and glory.
- 4 For thy loving-kindness is better than the life itself: / my lips shall praise thee.
- 5 As long as I live will I magnify thee in this manner, / and lift up my hands in thy Name.
- 6 My soul shall be satisfied, even as it were with marrow and fatness; / and my mouth shall praise thee with joyful lips.

- 7 When I remember thee upon my bed, / I meditate upon thee in the night-watches;
- 8 Because thou hast been my helper; / and under the shadow of thy wings will I rejoice.
- 9 My soul cleaveth unto thee; / thy right hand upholdeth me.

- 12 But the king shall rejoice in God; all they that swear by him shall be glad; / for the mouth of them that speak lies shall be stopped.

#### FIRST LESSON: 2 Samuel 15.17-21

The First Lesson is written in the second book of the prophet Samuel, in the fifteenth chapter, beginning at the seventeenth verse.

The king left, followed by all the people; and they stopped at the last house. All his officials passed by him; and all the Cherethites, and all the Pelethites, and all the six hundred Gittites who had followed him from Gath, passed on before the king. Then the king said to Ittai the Gittite, 'Why are you also coming with us? Go back, and stay with the king; for you are a foreigner, and also an exile from your home. You came only yesterday, and shall I today make you wander about with us, while I go wherever I can? Go back, and take your kinsfolk with you; and may the Lord show steadfast love and faithfulness to you.' But Ittai answered the king, 'As the Lord lives, and as my lord the king lives, wherever my lord the king may be, whether for death or for life, there also your servant will be.'

#### THE MAGNIFICAT

#### SECOND LESSON: John 11.1-16

The Second Lesson is written in the gospel according to Saint John, in the eleventh chapter, beginning at the first verse.

Now a certain man was ill, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who anointed the Lord with perfume and wiped his feet with her hair; her brother Lazarus was ill. So the sisters sent a message to Jesus, 'Lord, he whom you love is ill.' But when Jesus heard it, he said, 'This illness does not lead to death; rather it is for God's glory, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it.' Accordingly, though Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, after having heard that Lazarus was ill, he stayed two days longer in the place where he was. Then after this he said to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judea again.' The disciples said to him, 'Rabbi, the Jews were just now trying to stone you, and are you going there again?' Jesus answered, 'Are there not twelve hours of daylight? Those who walk during the day do not stumble, because they see the light of this world. But those who walk at night stumble, because the light is not in them.' After saying this, he told them, 'Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep, but I am going there to awaken him.' The disciples said to him, 'Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will be all right.' Jesus, however, had been speaking about his death, but they thought that he was referring merely to sleep. Then Jesus told them plainly, 'Lazarus is dead. For your sake I am glad I was not there, so that you may believe. But let us go to him.' Thomas, who was called the Twin, said to his fellow-disciples, 'Let us also go, that we may die with him.'
