#### FOUNDATION COURSE FOR READING BIBLICAL HEBREW

This fall we will be offering an introductory program that lays the foundations of a basic competence in reading Biblical Hebrew. The course will consist of eight sessions held on Zoom, beginning on October 5 and continuing Wednesday evenings 7-9 p.m. until November 30. (There will be no session on November 2 due to the All Souls Requiem at 6:30 that evening.)

The course will bring participants to a knowledge of the core elements of Biblical Hebrew grammar through the scrutiny of Genesis, chapters 1-8. While no prior knowledge is necessary, participants who do not know the Hebrew alphabet should contact John Stuart at *john\_oh\_usa@yahoo.com* for materials that will introduce them to the alphabet and one other critical element of Hebrew, Functors.

John will be our course guide and is happy to field any questions or inquiries from those considering signing up for the program. He is also prepared to help people relate to the alphabet and the material on Functors prior to the program's commencement if necessary.

#### ANOTHER APPEAL FOR PAPER

Obtaining legal-sized paper for printing our booklets still proves to be challenging. We believe this is due to supply chain issues. Staples and Mr Case have both failed to deliver cases of paper (or even reams) for several weeks now, and Amazon, Costco, and other suppliers don't carry paper in the size that we need.

Yes, the booklets could be re-formatted to use letter-sized paper (which *is* available), but this would make them much longer, unwieldy for the printer, and it would take more time to print them all. As it is right now, we use nearly 3 reams of legal paper a week to print our booklets (1,500 sheets).

As a result, Christine and others have had to go personally to Staples, to purchase as many reams of paper as they will allow (sometimes limited to two, depending on the store). It is then hauled back to the office in a cart, via the subway.

How can you help, you ask?

We need people willing to go to their local Staples, to purchase one or two reams of legal-sized (11" x 14") paper and deliver it to St. Thomas's, perhaps every other week, for the next few weeks. Be sure to bring a receipt, and we will reimburse you. If you could please let Christine know how much to expect, and when, that would be very helpful, too – office@sttthomas.on.ca.
